Kenneth Mason Hourigan, 87, of 1395 Shakertown Road, died Saturday, February 19 at the James B. Haggin Memorial Hospital.

Born December 24, 1912 in Marion county, he was the son of the late Robert and Clydie Rexroad Hourigan.

He was a former Harrodsburg Policeman for eight years, was a former Mercer county deputy sheriff and had served as Mercer County sheriff from 1973-1977.

He was a U. S. Army veteran of World War II, where he was a prisoner of war and a survivor of the Bataan Death March. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, Douglas Laws Post #52, American Legion, and a former member of the Kentucky Sheriff's Association.

He was a member of the Fellowship Baptist Church and was a retired farmer.

Survivors include: his wife, Sally Ann Tyler Hourigan, Harrodsburg; one daughter, Carolyn Hourigan Brown, Louisville; two brothers, Horace Hourigan, Harrodsburg, and Thomas Hourigan, Springfield; two sisters, Mary Helen Zeliff, Harrodsburg, and Ruth Sims, Williamsburg, OH; two grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, February 23, at the Alexander and Royalty Funeral Home with Dr. Kenneth Whitehouse officiating. Burial with military rites was in Spring Hill Cemetery.
